ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY

AIM

Lancashire Automobile Club (1902) Limited is committed, wherever possible, to undertaking actions and initiatives to reduce its impact on the environment and seeks to do so in a responsible manner.

OBJECTIVE

The Club's primary function is to enable members and non-members alike to utilise their cherished vehicles on planned authorised events in compliance with the sport's governing body, MSUK, and is committed to ensuring that in doing so it minimises its impact on the environment whilst positively benefitting local communities.

MAKING A POSITIVE IMPACT

To be environmentally positive, the Club actively promotes and implements a range of initiatives with the expressed intention of limiting its environmental impact. Such initiatives include;

- Making the policy visible via the Club website www.lancsautoclub.com.
- Utilising web tools (such as Google Maps) when creating and mapping routes, resulting in saved fuel and associated emissions.
- Holding meetings via on-line platforms such as Zoom, MS Teams and others as available.
- Car sharing, wherever possible, when attending in-person meetings.
- Sending promotional event information via electronic channels.
- Enabling and promoting event entries to be made on-line as opposed to paper applications.
- Electronically issuing route books and event information literature in order to reduce ink and paper usage.
- Optimising event road mileages leading to lower average speeds and thus reduced fuel consumption and associated emissions.

- Promoting the adherence of the Quiet Lanes principle.
- Active carbon offsetting of event mileages via recognised FBHVC provider, Tree-V.
- Enabling and encouraging members to utilise their electrically powered vehicles on Club events.
- Encouraging members to maintain their vehicles and thus delay the effects of pollutants caused by the disposal process.

BEST PRACTICE

The Club's Directors and Committee are proactive in their approach to positive environmental impacts and seek to ensure that best practice guidance is implemented wherever possible.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

In order to ensure that this policy is enacted upon, the Club has supporting guidance and information which is provided via an associated procedure detailed within the Directors' and Club Officers Operations Manual.

MONITORING & REVIEW

As part of the process to ensure that this policy remains relevant and up-to-date, the Directors will review on an annual basis, as a minimum, will record this action within meeting minutes and will undertake any necessary steps required to ensure compliance and relevance.
